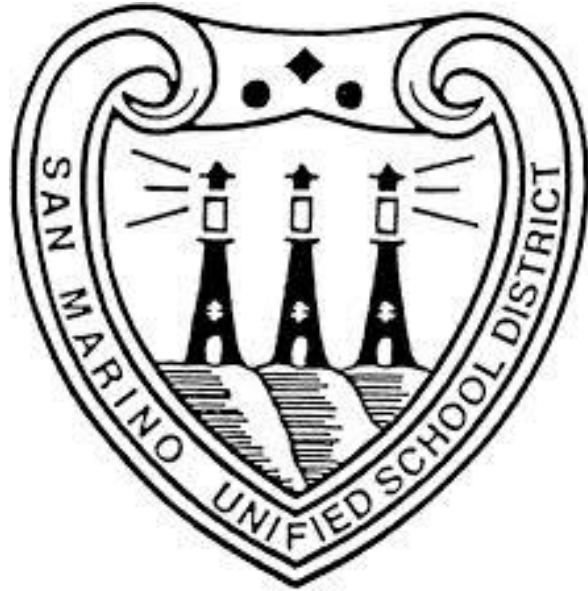

Dual Enrollment

2003- Senate Bill 338:

- Provide educational enrichment opportunities for eligible high school students.

2016- Assembly Bill 288:

- Allows community college districts to enter into a College and Career Access Pathways partnership (CCAP) with local school districts with the goal of developing seamless pathways from high school to community college for career technical education or preparation for transfer, improving high school graduation rates, or helping high school pupils achieve college and career readiness.

Students may earn college and high school credits by taking community college classes during their high school day.

Students participating under this agreement may enroll in up to a maximum of 15 units per term.

Quick view at the MOU

- **Student fees:** Fees associated with CCAP courses will be waived.
- **Faculty:** PCC will assign the faculty. SMUSD staff/faculty that meet minimum qualifications for CCC, may apply to become part-time faculty. SMUSD will work with bargaining groups to ensure understanding of the opportunity to teach PCC classes.
- **Students:** Any student from SMUSD may have access to the classes. PCC will work with the district and schools to provide information on pre-requisite and co-requisites for courses prior to the courses being offered.
- **Course Materials:** SMUSD will take on all costs associated with instructional materials (i.e. textbooks, equipment, and supplies). PCC will explore ways to minimize the cost of textbooks and instructional materials (i.e. Open Educational Resources).
- **Course Selection:** PCC will work with the high school and district Liaison to identify classes, they schedule and dates to ensure they meet the needs of the community and follow CCAP requirements.
 - **CTE, Transfer, improving high school graduation rates, or college and career readiness.**
 - PACCD and SMUSD will ensure that no PACCD or SMUSD faculty is displaced as a result of this agreement.

Course Selection

AB 288-Requirements

- **CTE, Transfer, improving high school graduation rates, or college and career readiness**
- If Non-CCAP
 - Open to the community
 - Offered after school
 - Credit can be used at High school or PCC or both
- If CCAP
 - Restricted to only SMUSD students
 - Offered during the students school day
 - Requires
 - Credit for both PCC and SMUSD
