The Comprehensive School Safety Plan (CSSSP)

- Required by California Education Code (32281-32289)
- Annually reviewed by school sites and updated by March 1st
- Submitted for approval to the District's Governing Board



Components of the CSSP (EC 32281)

- **Child Abuse Reporting Procedures** (EC 35294.2 [a] [2]; PC 11166)
- **Disaster Procedures** (EC 35295-35297; GC 8607/3100)
- **School Suspension, Expulsion and Mandatory Expulsion Guidelines**
- **Procedures to Notify Teachers of Dangerous Pupils** (EC 49079)
- **Sexual Harassment Policies** (EC 212.6 [b])
- **School-wide Dress Code Relating to Gang-Related Apparel** (EC 35183)



Components of the CSSP (EC 32281)

- Rules and Procedures – Discipline (BP)
- A Safe and Orderly School Environment Conducive to Learning (EC 35294.2)
- School Discipline Rules and Consequences (EC 35291 / 35291.5)
- Hate Crime Reporting Procedures and Policies
- Procedures for Preventing Acts of Bullying and Cyber-bullying
- Incident Command Team Responsibilities



Components of the CSSP (EC 32281)

- Unified Command
- Documentation and Record Keeping
- Emergency Response Procedures
 - Aircraft Crash
 - Bomb Threat/ Threat of violence
 - Reunification and Release Procedures
 - Chemical or Hazardous Material Exposure Procedures
 - Demobilization & Post-emergency Procedures
 - Earthquake
 - Explosion or Risk Of Explosion
 - Fire on School Grounds
 - Flooding
 - High Heat & Heat Illness Procedures
 - Lockdown Procedures
 - Medical First Aid Procedures
 - Return-to-Play Considerations
 - Search & Rescue Procedures



California Assembly Bill AB 1747

- Requires that plans include procedures for tactical responses to criminal incidents, based on the specific needs and context of each school and community.
- Encourages school districts to consult with law enforcement
- Encourages policies aimed at preventing bullying and cyberbullying

Compliance Review Process

- CSSPs are reviewed annually to ensure that they comply with all current state and federal laws and requirements.
- School Site Councils reviewed the updates to the CSSP
- Consulted with the Chief of Police and Fire Chief and shared CSSPs for review
