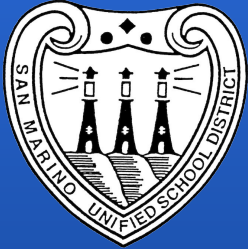

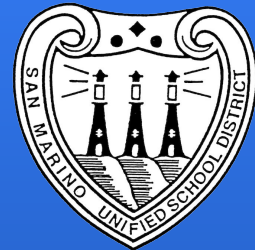

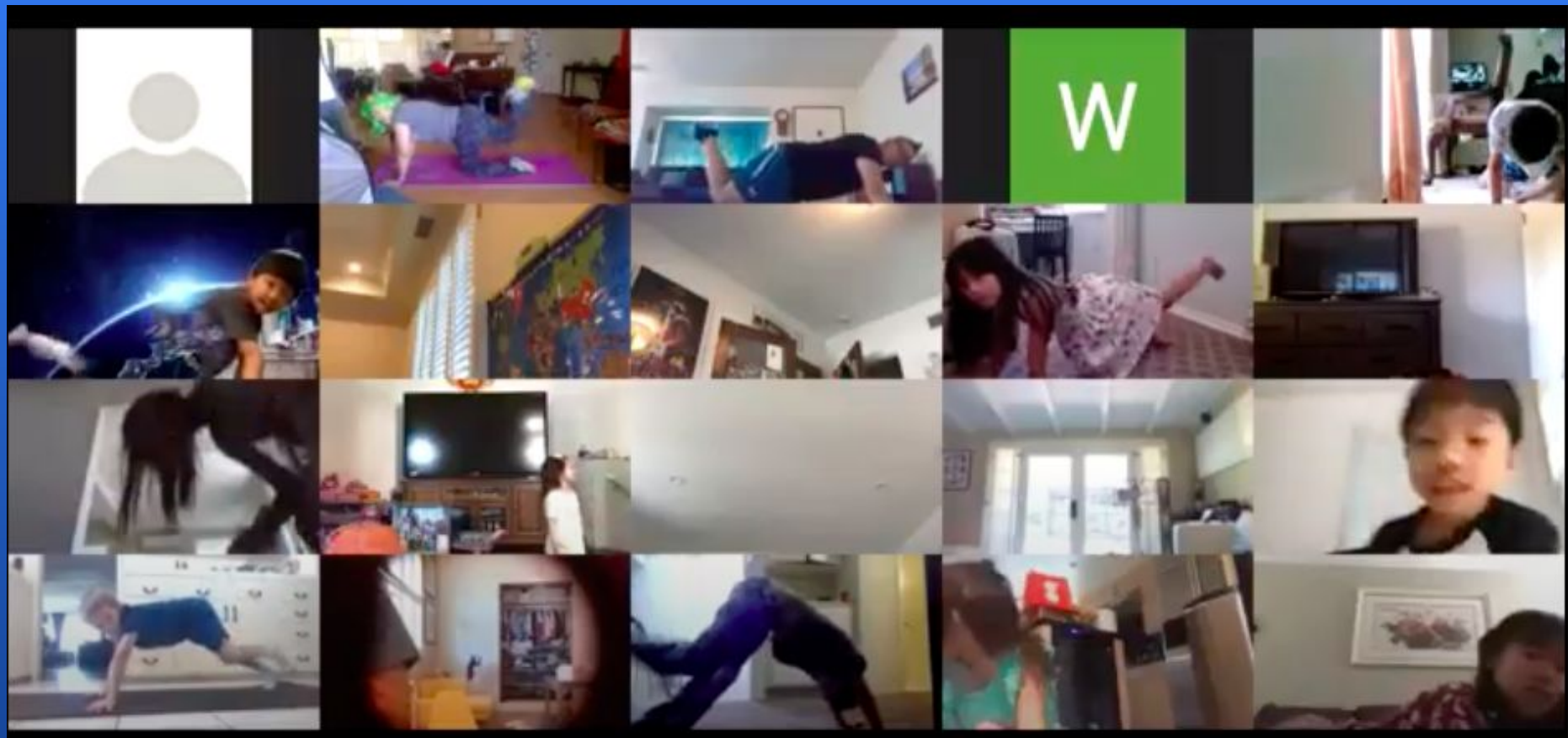

- Daily student attendance has been very high! Average 98% daily
- Our focus has been on making meaningful connections with students. All teachers are meeting every morning with students. Small group meetings, office hours for live interactions & questions, lunch bunch groups, live PE classes. Reading Intervention Lesson TK Lessons Kindergarten Fourth Grade Lessons Fifth Grade Guest Reader for Kindergarten PE for TK & 1st.

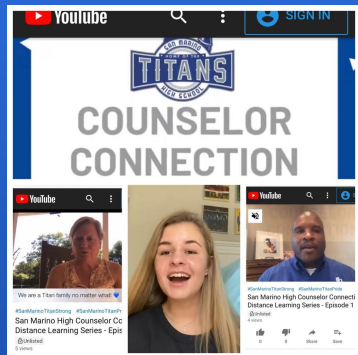

Distance Learning Update

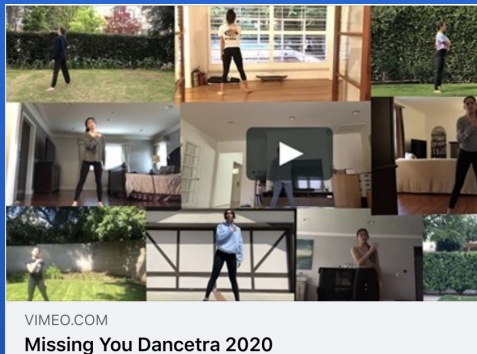
- Grades - SMHS prioritized wellness as the foundational tenet of distance learning and will exercise care and compassion while addressing students' educational needs through distance learning.

Counselors help students connect to teachers and each other during student dismissal



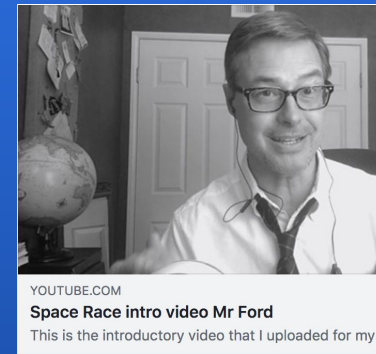
Performance Art
